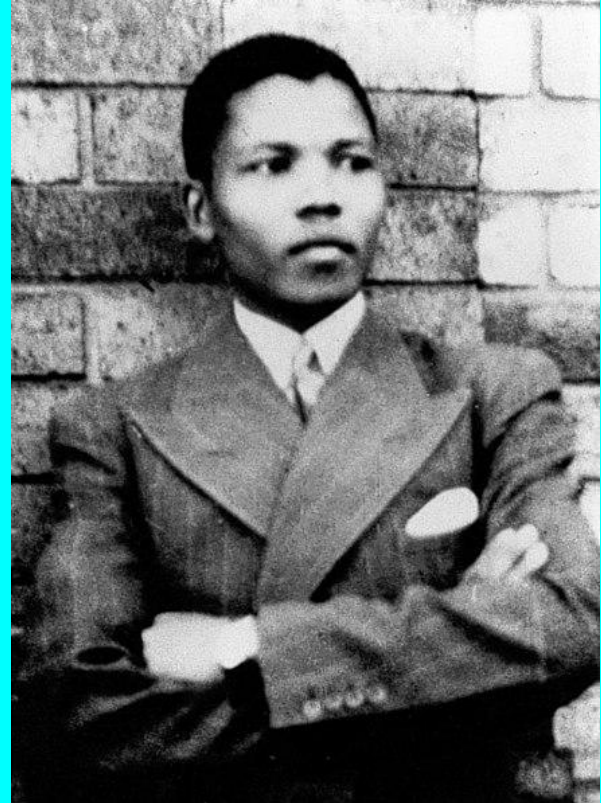

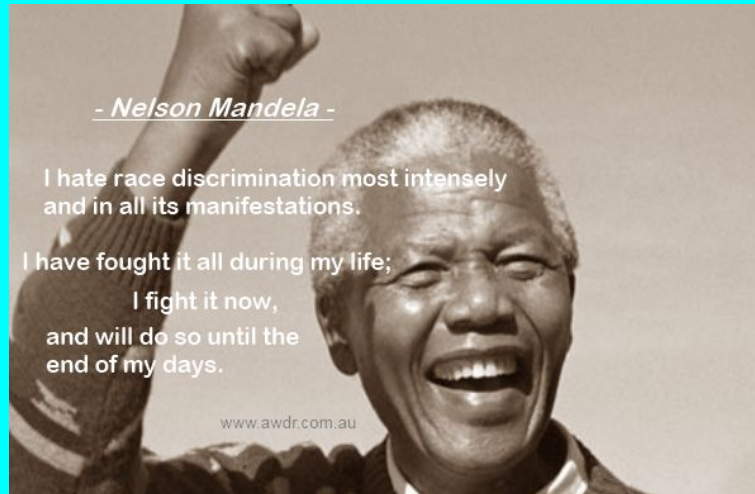
Education

End of apartheid

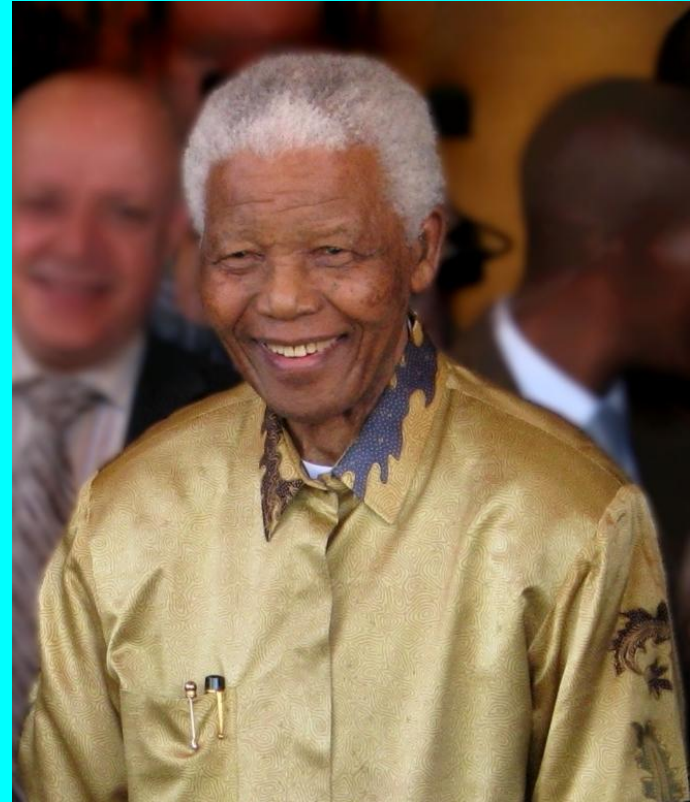
